**ORDER ON RESPONDENT'S MOTION TO DETERMINE CONFIDENTIALITY OF
COURT RECORDS**

THIS CAUSE came on to be heard before the Court, at hearing on June 2, 2022, on Husband's/Respondent's Motion to Determine Confidentiality of Court Records, to which Wife/Petitioner has no objection. Counsel for both parties and Wife were present via Zoom. The Court, hearing argument of counsel, reviewing the motion and court file, and being otherwise advised in the premises, hereby finds as follows:

- A. The Court has jurisdiction over the parties and subject matter hereto.
- B. Husband/Respondent is a former law enforcement officer.

Accordingly, it is

ORDERED that:

- 1. Husband's/Respondent's Motion to Determine Confidentiality of Court Records is hereby granted in part as to social security, bank account, charge, debit, and credit card numbers per Section 119.0714(1)(i)-(j), (2)(a)-(e), Florida Statutes, and to the child's date of birth and full name per Florida Rules of General Practice

and Judicial Administration 2.420(d)(B)(iii) and 2.425 in all pleadings now filed or filed in the future in this matter, subject to the exceptions outlined in Rule 2.420(b).

2. Husband's/Respondent's Motion to Determine Confidentiality of Court Records is hereby granted in part as to (1) the Husband's/Respondent's home addresses, telephone numbers, dates of birth, and photographs of said party, and (2) the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, photographs, dates of birth, and places of employment of the Wife and child, and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the child, per Section 119.071(4)(d)2a, Florida Statutes, and related statutory sections, as exempt from public records, in all pleadings now filed or filed in the future in this matter and from any court records provided to, or made accessible to, the public by the Clerk of Court.
3. The type of case in this matter is a Dissolution of Marriage action.
4. Persons who are permitted to view the information outlined in Paragraphs 1 and 2 above are: The Honorable Judge, in front of whom this action is heard; Husband/Respondent, and his counsel; and Wife/Petitioner, and her counsel.
5. The Court finds that the degree, duration, and manner of confidentiality ordered by the Court are no broader than necessary to protect the interests set forth in subdivision (c) of Rule 2.420 of Florida Rules of General Practice and Judicial Administration, as well as Chapter 119, Florida Statutes; and no less restrictive measures are available to protect the interests set forth in subdivision (c) of Rule 2.420, as well as Chapter 119, Florida Statutes.

6. The Clerk of the Court is directed to publish the order in accordance with subdivision (e)(4) of Rule 2.420. Within ten (10) days following the entry of this Order, the Clerk of Court is directed to post a copy of this Order on the clerk's website, and in the prominent, public location in the courthouse. This Order must remain posted in both locations for no less than thirty (30) days.
7. Any and all requests to vacate all or part of this Order shall be made in the form of the written motion. The movant must serve all parties and all affected non-parties in the action with a copy of the motion.
